8. **The number of credits to be completed for the Master's degree:** 120 credits

9. **Degrees accepted for admittance into the Master's programme**
 - 9.1. Accepted with the complete credit value: international studies and international governance undergraduate courses.
 - 9.2. May be primarily considered with the completion of the credits in undergraduate studies in the fields of social sciences, the humanities, economics, law, and political science.
 - 9.3. For entering the Master's programme, a minimum of 60 credits is necessary from the following subject areas:
 - introduction to social science: sociology, psychology, philosophy, anthropology, psychology
 - legal-governance studies: public law and civil law, constitutional law, public administration science, public policy, business law
 - economic studies: economy, macro and microeconomics, corporate economics, finance, international economics
 - political science: political thought, political history, international studies,
 - historical, cultural, and linguistic studies: economy, social and cultural history studies, linguistic, filologic studies.

The prerequisite of admittance into the Master's programme is for the student to have at least 30 credits. Missing credits must be attained as defined in the higher education institution's Study and Exam Regulations.
10. **Master's degree training objectives and professional competences:** The objective of the programme is the training of experts who, with their attained theoretical knowledge, are capable of analysing the tendencies of current international political and economic relationships. With their knowledge of international economics, international law, international relation theories, regional-civilisational interdisciplinary knowledge, and mastery of the terminology, they are prepared to understand the interrelationships of a globalising international system. They are capable of an in-depth analysis of a region's economic, political, and social context. They are prepared to continue their training at the PhD level.

11. Thesis: The requirements for the thesis/portfolio thesis: in accordance with the Kodolányi János University Thesis Regulations, which are available on the KJE Student Information website. The aim of the dissertation is to certify the student's knowledge and expertise in a chosen topic, scientific data collection, systematization, analysis and processing related to the chosen topic, discussion of the chosen phenomenon or problem, hypothesis creation, problem solving, analysis of alternative hypotheses, analysis and in refuting the counter-arguments, in a coherent, consistent, language-oriented written explanation of his thoughts, views, positions, statements.

12. Final exam: The final complex examination (or also called state exam) is a two-part exam which takes place at the end of the official exam period.

The final examination is a test and assessment of the knowledge, skills and competences required to obtain a qualification, during which the student must also demonstrate that he or she can apply the knowledge acquired.

Criteria for passing the final examination:

- fulfilment of the requirements set out in the curriculum (obtaining the diploma);
- the completion of a thesis and a mark of at least satisfactory, with a recommended mark of at least satisfactory.

Components of the final examination:

- defence of the thesis;
- complex oral examination.

Method of calculation of the result: The average of the results of the thesis defence and the complex oral examination.

Qualification of the diploma: The grade of the diploma is the rounded average of the following grades:

- the result of the final complex oral examination
- the average result of the student's grade point average per semester (which is also recorded in the transcript of records).

13. Foreign language requirements: In order to obtain a Master's degree, you must have an advanced level of foreign language proficiency (level C1) in a foreign language and an intermediate level of foreign language proficiency (level B2) in another foreign language, at least one of which must be at the level of a professional foreign language corresponding to the field of study of social sciences, law, economics or public administration.
